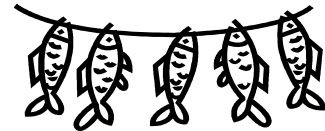

2. Please do NOT fish on a homeowner's property that borders the pond without that owner's permission. The shared areas of the pond are the East and South ends where no homes are located. Any PCN resident may fish from there.

Spring Clean Up

Helpful hints for preparing for summer

1. Check your siding for any storm damage; consider having someone check your roof to be sure no damage has occurred there.
2. Now is the time to fight those weeds – especially the thistle! Thistle requires seeds to spread, so getting rid of it now before it has time to create a seed head can help prevent it spreading in the summer. Caution – if you pull it out – be sure to get ALL the root system. If you use a herbicide – try “painting” it on all the foliage while wearing gloves... the wind can catch it if you spray and adjacent plants will suffer (as my Rose of Sharon will sadly tell you).
3. Mowing and edging the lawn – it seems as if we will be forced to start early this year. To help your lawn remain healthy:
 - Consider a tune up of your mower this spring
 - Sharpen the mower blades – it makes a world of difference
 - “Mow early, Mow often, Mow high”
 - early in the am, but after dew dries
 - every 7-10 days
 - mowing height 2-2.5 inches

As courtesies to everyone in PCN:

- *Please do sweep or blow off the sidewalk after you mow or edge
- *Please keep your pets (dogs AND cats) on leashes and clean up after them. Carmel does have a leash law for all household pets.
